In order to get off to a quick start this fall, the following assignments need to be completed **before** the first day of classes on August 9, 2023. (* Date has not been announced.)

You will need a 2” loose-leaf (three-ring binder) and one “fat” spiral notebook. The binder will be for your classwork, notes, and handouts. The spiral notebook will be for your Cornell Notes from your reading assignments and for your vocabulary. You will need a book cover for your textbook.

For your Summer Assignment, please read *The Cartoon History of the United States* by Larry Gonick. Be prepared to discuss it and complete assignments on it beginning on the first day of school, August 9, 2023.

You will need to purchase or rent a copy of *After the Fact: The Art of Historical Detection* (Sixth Edition). The authors are James West Davidson and Mark Hamilton Lytle. Read the Introduction and the Prologue (on “The Strange Death of Silas Deane”). Take Cornell Notes.

Over the summer I encourage you to read as much history as you can, fiction or nonfiction. I also encourage you to visit historic sites, museums, and house museums. I encourage you to watch documentaries and historically based movies, as well. A newer one based on the novel *The Underground Railroad* is now available on Amazon Prime.

For this class, it will be imperative that you **read** all the assignments. We will learn a great deal of American history and we will move quickly. I look forward to working with you this year. I’ll be glad to see you on August 9.
